Class Format:

Students are to be seated with their books open to the work completed since they were last in class *when the bell rings*. A question that either relates to previous work or that introduces the day's lesson will be on the board for them to complete. This will either be taken up in class or it will be checked and students will receive feedback the next day. **Homework will be checked on ALL in person days.** For each chapter the students will be responsible for homework completion and a chapter test. Additional quizzes (both online in Edsby and in person) and assignments will be given at the teacher's discretion.

Course Website, Edsby Journal, Class Notebook:

All three of these locations will be updated regularly to show all homework, assignments, and tests. Notes will be posted by unit along with links to video lessons. When students are in class, notes will be provided for lessons occurring that day. When students are working from home they are responsible for copying or printing notes, and watching the video lesson to fill them in. Because we are in a hybrid learning model, it is imperative that students take responsibility for their learning by using one of these resources regularly. **Students are expected to come in to class prepared for the current lesson, so they must complete the assigned lessons and work on their asynchronous learning days!**

Extra Help:

Students can contact Mrs. Ryan through Edsby if they need help with work being completed at home. Full homework solutions for text books questions and handouts will also be posted for students to use to identify errors or to get started on a problem.
